CALCUTTA, INDIA — Moslem "Aton Day" which saw India's Moslems demonstrate for establishment of their autonomous dream state of "Pakistan," touched off one of the most murderous riots in the violent history of Calcutta. After three days of violent battle, sized riots a semblance of order was restored to the city and a grim tally of 3,468 corpses was counted in the city's streets. This photograph which has just reached the United States shows bodies of the victims of violence. They are still in the debris-littered street — the photograph was made before it was safe to count and carry away the dead.

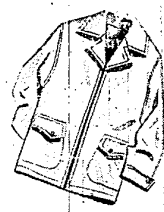

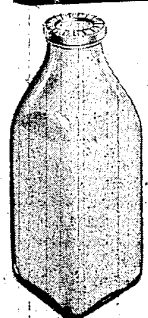
