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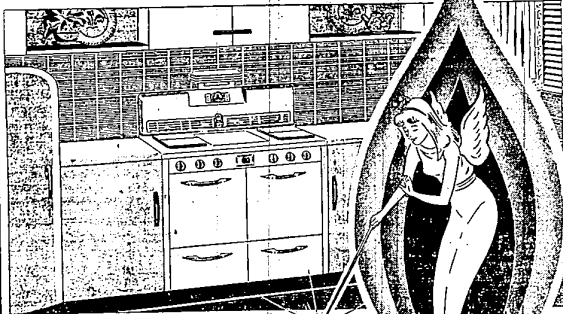

anticipating no more than was spent annually during the more normal period of twenty years ago. "A recent survey by the State Department of Public Instruction shows an immediate need for additional classrooms which at prevailing prices would cost at least \$92,701,000 to build.

"To summarize:
Estimated state school-aid needs for the current school year for salaries for all public school employees and needed supplies and equipment, \$86,252,405.

Average annual additional school building needs, \$13,250,000.
Total, \$104,552,405.

"There is no need to fear that an amendment would prevent the state Legislature from continuing a formula of school distribution to equalize school opportunities over the state. The amendment would guarantee to public schools annually from the general fund of the state an amount equal to 12.5 per cent of the sales tax revenue of the preceding fiscal year, in addition to one-sixth of the current sales tax receipts to be distributed as the Legislature shall decide.

"Under the present state school aid formula, the Primary School Interest Fund (which is an allotment per census school child) is a deductible item from the most equitable source of income for the state government will be sufficient for reasonable needs of other state institutions, and other state agencies and services.

"If the bonus proposal carries, it would be a special item of expense for which a new source of revenue should be provided. "Education is the biggest and the most important business in which the state is engaged. Proposal No. 2 will provide enough state aid which together with local taxes for schools could finance a good program of education for Michigan's million boys and girls. We could afford billions for war. We can afford \$100 per school child in state aid for education."

Application forms for amputees and other World War II veterans who lost the use of one or both legs at or above the ankle and are eligible for Government financed automobiles are now in the hands of Veterans Administration contact representatives and regional offices.

Besides the basic qualification of disability, there are several features of the cars-for-amputees law that should be born in mind.

The total purchase price of a car must not exceed \$1,000, including the cost of such special attachments as are necessary to make the vehicle safe for operation and any tax which is reflected in the purchase price. This means that the applicant for a car will not be allowed a \$1,000 credit against the price of a more expensive automobile.

The VA will pay only the seller. Veterans cannot be reimbursed for cars already purchased. They should not purchase a car on the assumption that they can collect the cost later.

The Veterans Administration will not authorize payment for a car sold to a veteran who does not have a license to operate it. The applicant must have an operator's license that satisfies the motor vehicle laws of the State. The office of Veterans' Affairs is working out a training program in co-operation with the Department of State Motor Vehicle Division and the Michigan State Police to assure eligible veterans every opportunity to become sufficiently proficient in driving to secure an operator's license.

When the above stipulations can be filled, the procedure is relatively simple. Steps to be taken in the procurement of automobiles are as follows:

1. Obtain an application form from the nearest VA contact representative or VA office, either by mail or in person.
2. Mail the completed form to the VA regional office having jurisdiction over the applicant's compensation claim file. (Retired officers eligible for automobiles should mail their completed forms to the central office, Veterans Administration, Washington, D. C.)
3. After processing, the form will be returned to the applicant.
4. The applicant then takes his approved form, together with his operator's license, to the local vehicle licensing agency. If all local requirements are met, the licensing agency will enter the fact on the application form, along with notations of such special attachments as are deemed necessary.

After certification by the licensing agency, the applicant may present his application form to any dealer or individual of his choice and negotiate for the automobile or other conveyance.

When the conveyance has been delivered, the seller presents the necessary papers to the VA regional office having jurisdiction, for prompt payment.
