**BLUE STAR MOTHERS OPERATE REHABILITATION LODGE FOR GIs**



The facilities of this beautiful home, owned by the Blue Star Mothers of America, are available to any G.I. who has the endorsement of his local Blue Star Chapter, or whose qualifications are otherwise recognized.

This beautiful rest center is for boys who are too well to be hospitalized, but who still need complete rest and relaxation for a period of time. It is located on Indian Lake Road, northeast of Lake Orion village. The Blue Star Mothers of the state purchased this home for \$18,000 and now operate it for the use of GIs who may stay at the home without charge to him for two weeks, or longer if his case merits it.

The home is a nearly new log house, erected as a permanent residence, in a beautiful grove overlooking Indian Lake, and is equipped with every modern year-round facility and convenience. Mr. and Mrs. A. G. Button are the caretakers and they have nine rooms in which to quarter the boys.

The Blue Star Mothers are asking the general public to apprise eligible boys of the opportunities offered. They invite an inspection of the home and its setting.

Any GI who wishes to spend a period, at the home should get in touch with the chairman of his local Blue Star Mothers Chapter, make application direct or through some other source, and his application will receive attention at once.
