

RED CROSS NOTES

The Junior Red Cross of the Oakland County Chapter began its Fall activities last week, according to Mrs. R. A. Armstrong, Junior chairman, when Miss Zelma Burk, Red Cross field representative, opened the chapter. Miss Burk met with principals, school sponsors and members of the Junior committee. At a dinner meeting at Pontiac High School Miss Burk stressed particularly the international program of Junior Red Cross stating that gift boxes sent by Juniors to children of foreign countries have filled a need for articles which have been found impossible to secure in devastated countries.

The National Red Cross Children's Fund to which Juniors contribute is used for shipments of powdered milk and medical supplies as well as for needs of children in this country. International correspondence between children of this country and foreign countries is a means of promoting understanding and good will.

Reports of Red Cross conferences were made by Bruce Wite, who attended the National convention at Philadelphia, Jean Will, who attended a Junior Red Cross training center in Montana; and Tom Knight who attended a Junior camp held in Genesee County.

Mrs. Arthur Selden, chairman of Mrs. John Kent, who assists her, Mrs. M. F. Macauley, packing chairman and Mrs. Myron Burk, assisted Mrs. Armstrong at the dinner.

Juniors are at present packing gift boxes which will be forwarded within the near future in order to reach foreign countries by Christmas.

Sixteen Red Cross volunteers and staff members attended a Red Cross meeting and luncheon in Detroit Wednesday, according to Marshall Smith, chairman of the chapter. The meeting was held in connection with the annual conference of the Michigan Welfare League and the Michigan Society for Mental Hygiene. Richard Swartz, deputy manager of the North Atlantic Area, and former Red Cross field representative in Michigan, was the speaker.

Mrs. Glenn Wilson and Mrs. T. W. Jackson, chairman and co-chairman of the Nurse Recruitment committee of the Oakland County Chapter American Red Cross, announced that Betty Jo Wieland, R.N., 1531 Annabelle, Ferndale, left yesterday by plane for Mantovese, Wisconsin, where she will assist in the polio epidemic. Miss Wieland is the second registered nurse from Oakland County to accept an assignment at Mantovese as Miss Wilma Fisher left Sunday and is now on duty.
