
GOVERNOR FAVORS STATEHOOD

VAN WAGONER TO CAMPAIGN IN OAKLAND COUNTY
Former Governor Murray D. ("Pat") Van Wagoner, Democratic candidate for re-election as governor of Michigan, will visit Southern Oakland County Thursday, October 17th. It was announced by the Oakland County Democratic Committee today. The Van Wagoner party will be greeted by Fernale Democrats at the corner of Nine Mile and Woodward Avenue (Southside Side) at 6:15 p.m. and a delegation from Hazel Park which will accompany the former Governor to a banquet to be held at 6:30 p.m. at the "Farmhouse" in Hazel Park. Following the banquet there will be a mass meeting at 7:30 p.m. at the Lacy School, 9 Mile Road and John R. in Hazel Park.
The Van Wagoner Party will then stop in Ferndale to address a Democratic rally at the VFW on Foster Street in Ferndale where Mr. Van Wagoner is scheduled to speak at 9:30 p.m. The events, which are being sponsored jointly by the Democratic Party organizations of Hazel Park, Ferndale and Royal Oak Township, are open to the public and everyone is invited to attend. "We want all the voters of Hazel Park, Ferndale and Royal Oak Township, regardless of party lines to hear firsthand from the former Governor himself, the record of his splendid accomplishments as Michigan's governor during the critical first years of the War," said John Francis, the Democratic county chairman. Thursday's event is the "kick-off" of Van Wagoner's campaign in Oakland County.
