## MICHIGAN LEADS IN VOLUNTEER ARMY ENLISTMENTS

Colonel Walter E. Cole, Commanding Officer of the Michigan Recruiting District, today announced that Michigan led the entire Fifth Army in volunteer Regular Army enlistments for the month of September.

Total enlistments accomplished during this record-breaking period were 2,976. First place in the twelve states in the Fifth Army Area was awarded on a basis of percentage of enlistments obtained compared to population of the state. Combined efforts of the twelve states in the Fifth Army Area have put Fifth Army near the top of the nation's six armies.

Colonel Cole anticipates another record-breaking month for October on the basis of the first four days. This is a new high level for four days, created by the wish of Michigan youths to obtain full benefit of the G. I. Bill of Rights by October 5.
