## COUNTY PROMOTES BOY SCOUT ACTIVITIES

During the war years, which put gasoline under rationing control, the Oakland Circle District of the Clinton Valley Council, Boy Scouts of America, was forced to operate on a very restricted basis, to such an extent that the greater part of Oakland County, outside of the City of Pontiac, could not receive the services that should be given by the Boy Scout Headquarters, operating from the city of Pontiac. Realizing this was true, Scout Executive Ed Leand has put in motion the moves necessary for an active operating District Committee.

Meeting in Waterford, the institutional representatives of all Scout units, under the jurisdiction of the Clinton Valley Council, Boy Scouts of America, in Oakland County, elected Ken Sanderson of Walpole Lake as District Chairman and set in motion three Round Table sessions and three training courses to be held in various parts of the County.

Under the direction of Assistant District Commissioner Ovis Gidcomb, a round table meeting was held at Drayton Plains on November 15. At Rochester another round table meeting will be held next week, under the supervision of Assistant District Commissioner Frank Chapman.

For the southern part of Oakland County, the Farmington area has been selected as the group to handle training sessions and round table conferences. Under the direction of Mr. Gilson of Farmington, the first training session and Round Table meeting will be held at Walnut Lake on November 19. Scoutmasters and committeemen and anyone interested in scouting may attend these sessions.

On November 20 at Waterford another meeting of the Oakland Circle District will be held for the purpose of organizing committees, district representatives to the Council annual meeting to be held in January and other organizational items that may be necessary. Farmington expects to have full representation at such district meetings in the future, and will then be able to be active participants in district planning of Scouting activities.
