LIFT ATTACHMENT
A yower lift attachment for tractors, easy-to-build and quick and
simple to put on and take off, has
been perfected by Michigan State
college agricultural engineers.
The device consists of an automobile wheel with a drum welded
to it, according to Karl D. Bailey,
county, agricultural agent. This
is mounted on the frame of the
tractor-in such a way the tire can
be pulled back to contact the belt
pulley. A brake is installed on the
other side of the tire to hold the
load in any, desired position.
Complete drawings for construction and illustrated views of how
the lift is attached are shown in

FARM WOODLOTS SOURCE OF PROFIT IF WELL MANAGED

Good management practices will insure a good profit from a farm woodlot for an indefinite number of years according to Ira Bull, Mi-chigan State College extension for-

An important management tice is the keeping of all lives out of the woods. Bull exp that cattle and sheep will br

out of the woods. Bull explains that cattle and sheep will browse off all the young seedlings and the leaf litter that provides hums to hold the soil and moisture.

Many large trees will die because of a lack of moisture as the leaf litter is not present to hold the moisture in the soil. No young trees will grow to take the place of the larger ones that are cut of the larger ones that are cut of the off. The woods will then eventually be cleared of timber and another field of attimps will result.


