### BAPTIST CHURCH TO OBSERVE BIBLE SUNDAY

Following the theme of the ancient text, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit saith the Lord of hosts," Farmington's First Baptist Church will join churches of many denominations in the observance of Universal Bible Sunday at the 10:00 a.m. service on Sunday, December 8. Bible reading calendars have already been distributed to the congregation, providing selected passages for daily reading from Thanksgiving to Christmas.

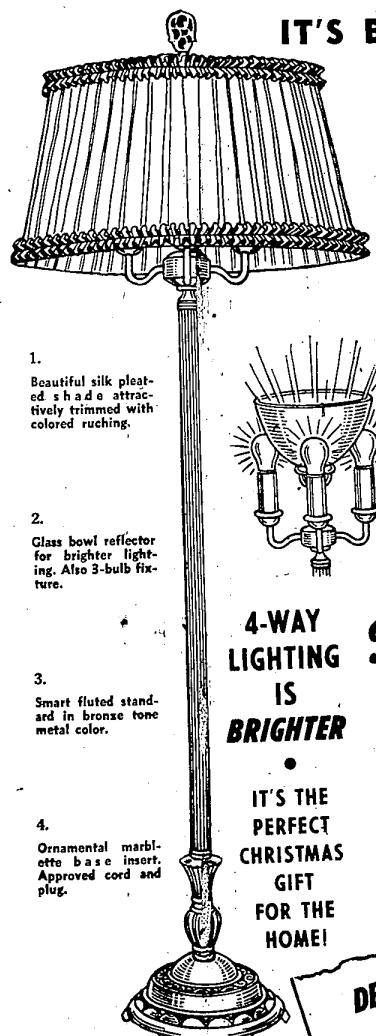
