

BLUE AND WHITE RECEIVES HIGH HONORS

An international second place award for "distinctive achievement in journalism" was given to the Blue and White staff, in the 1946 Critical Service conducted by the Quill and Scroll through the University of Michigan.

A hand-drawn certificate of award was sent to the Journalism Department by the judges under the direction of Dr. Lawrence R. Campbell. With the certificate were enclosed comments and suggestions, which have served as a most useful guide in improving the publication.

For a first place award, 500 points were required. The Blue and White received 791, thus making a first place award by only nine points.


