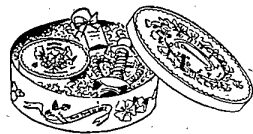

An international second place

A hand engrossed certificate of

Department by the judges under
the direction of Dr. Lawrence R.
Campbell. With the certificate

the publication.

For a first place award, 800
points were required. The Blue
and White received 791, thus mak-

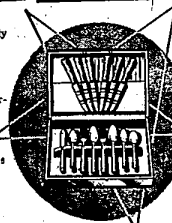
