April 4. Naomi Cox and Betty Hunt named valedictorian and salutatorian of 1946 class of Farmington High School.

April 5. Farmington Band ordered to bandstand at Clarencerville.

April 10. Fire of undetermined origin destroys Lindahl home.

April 11. Twelve Junior and Senior members inducted into Quill and Scroll, International Honorary Society of high school journalists, at special candle light services.

April 23. Fred Wilkinson elected president of Township Civic Association.
