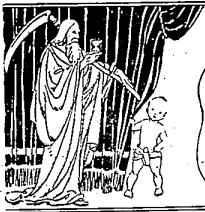

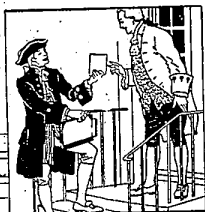

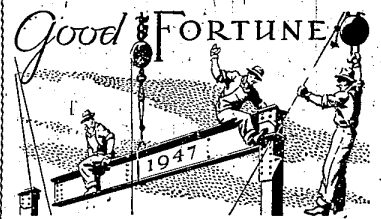

## A Message to ALL COAL USERS
