New Bell Telephone Almanacs Now Available

Farmington residents interested in securing the 1947 Telephone almanac may do so by stopping at the Michigan Bell Telephone Company Business Office on south Farmington Road. The new almanacs have just been released and are now available.

A publication of the American Telephone & Telegraph Company, the Almanac this year features the life and work of Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone, whose birthday anniversary occurs in March. The Bell System, as it operates today, conforms to the original pattern for a nationwide telephone service conceived by Bell and his associates.

As usual, the almanac contains astronomical calculations, and important historical dates, including a capsule history of telephone development in the United States. Michigan was the ninth state in the country to have a telephone exchange with the establishment of the Detroit exchange August 15, 1878.
