This State for some years has been second in the national bulb industry and is now very close to being in first position, states Charles Figy, Director of the State

During the past sixty days the Burean of Plant industry has inspected over a mil-ipon buils for disease and insect pests. 

# PLANTS HEALTHY ALL WINTER

Whether you received a poin-settia or another kind of plant for Christmas, you probably are wo-dering right now how to keep it looking fresh and healthy.

C. E. Wilson, research professor of horticulture at Michigan State college, says that plant care is a simple matter of watering and fertilization.

it the question of when to water the plant bothers you, tap the side of the pot. If the sound is dull, the plant does not need water. A hijlow sound means the plant needs a thorough watering. All plants, are better if watered with rain water. If the question of when to water

Polneettias suffer from wide changes of temperature and from dry air. Most plants should have in with a relative humbilty of 40 to 70 percent. You may need actitional pans of water if the one in your heating system is not sufficient. Poinsettias are also sensitive to gas tumes.

need pleaty of moisture. You may
need to water it twice a day —
ordinary well water will do. As
a precaution against mites, push

Azaleas do best in cool temperatures — about 20 degrees lower
than room temperature. Never
water them with hard or artificially softened water. Every two
or three months use water treated
with a pinch of alum or tannic
acid-to the quart. In May you can
set it in a cool, shady border outof-doors.

Christmas begonias require frequent watering until the flowers drop. Then allow them to dry off gradually for two or three months. In May they can be repotted in a soll containing about one-third leaf mold or acid peat and kept in the bourse.

Large, pot-bound or actively growing plants may need extra fertilizer as often as every two weeks.

Use a good brand of concentrated plant food — but not too much.
