VETERANS NEWS
From the OFFICE OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS LANSING
VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS STUDY STATE LEGISLATION AFFECTING VETERANS
Governor Sigler has called for the united efforts of the organized veterans of Michigan in preparing administration - sponsored legislation to coordinate all programs for veterans operated by the state of Michigan.
On December 30, Dr. Eugene B. Elliott, Superintendent of Public Instruction, at the request of the Governor, called a meeting of the state department commanders, adjutants, service officers and legislative chairmen of the five major veterans' organizations in the state, with representatives of the Office of Veterans' Affairs and the Michigan Veterans' Trust Fund Board of Trustees. At this meeting the various programs for veterans were discussed and a conclusion was reached that a need was apparent for coordination of the programs in the interest of efficiency and economy. The Office of Veterans' Affairs was instructed to prepare new legislation directed at accomplishing the above named objectives and submitting it to another meeting of the same group on January 8.
The legislation was prepared and submitted to a meeting in which all organizations were fully represented. The proposed legislation was studied and analyzed in detail. At the conclusion of this five-hour meeting, a committee consisting of one representative of each veterans' organization, delegated by the department commanders, was formed to study the certain points raised in the proposed legislation and to reach a mutual agreement on the points in question, to report back to the over-all committee at a meeting to be called in the near future, when it is expected final approval of the various groups will be given to the proposed legislation.
Governor Sigler attended each of the meetings and stated that the conclusions reached by the veterans' organizations would be "good enough for me". This approach by the administration to the overall veteran program was enthusiastically commended by all veterans because they said it places in their hands the responsibility of formulating state legislation for submission to the legislature. It was termed a very realistic approach and all agreed that it should result in a state program which will eliminate any duplication of effort which may now exist, and effect a coordination and integration of services to veterans, resulting in a greater degree of efficiency in operation and thus effect savings in administrative costs. At the same time the veterans would be better served by such an integrated program, those in attendance stated.
