HOME AGENT GIVES TIPS ON NEW PLASTIC CURTAINS

If you plan to buy some of the new plastic materials for curtains for your home, you will be surprised with the results you can get with a few well-placed stitches. Mary J. E. Woodward, county home demonstration agent, advises that you use a longer stitch for plastic — about 10 stitches to the inch.

You may have trouble making the plastic move along under the pressure of the machine. A strip of tissue under the plastic probably will eliminate this. If not, place another strip next to the pressure foot.

Plastic material does not need to be hemmed. It will not fray or get out of shape. This reduces the amount of work and stitching. If you want a hem at the bottom edge to give the effect of weight or for extra strength, just turn the material up once.

You can make curtain headings with plastic that are quite effective and stand up nicely. Plastics gather easily and will hang in long, soft folds. You can also make attractive ruffles with the material. Plastic curtains are as simple to keep clean as they are to make.
