To the Qualified Electors of the City of Farmington, County of Oakland, State of Michigan: NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law", I, the undersigned City Clerk, will upon any day except Sunday and a legal holiday, or Primary Election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter in said City not already registered, who may apply to me personally, for such registration. Provided, however, that I can receive no names for registration during the time intervening between the Twentieth Day before any regular, special or official primary election, and the day of such election.

A. 1941, from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on said day for the purpose of receiving the registration and registering such of the qualified electors in said City as shall apply therefor.
