From where I sit, that's one of the reasons the Hoskinses are the happiest, oldest-married, peace-fulest folks in our town.





New Dairy Testing Group Organizes

A meeting to organize Oakland County's first Owner-Sampler Dairy Testing Association has been scheduled for Wisconsin Community Hall on Monday evening, March 17, at 8:00 o'clock.

The purpose of the meeting is to explain the operation of the program and to sign up farmers for membership in the association. Glen Robinson, manager of the local artificial breeders group, will do the testing work in conjunction with his duties as insemination manager.

E. W. Alchia, Assistant County Agent in charge of the meeting, will explain the new program. Under the Owner-Sampler plan for testing milk, herd managers will take their own milk samples, and weigh the milk from each cow. The samples will be picked up by the tester, tested and recorded and the records returned to the herd owner. This plan will enable owners to do a better job of culling their herds and to select the better cows from which to save heifer calves.

State Highway Grants Construction Contracts

Law bidders on Michigan State Highway Department Construction projects were announced last week by Highway Commissioner C. M. Ziegler.

Among the projects is 1,265 miles of concrete pavement and pavement widening with bituminous concrete resurfacing course on US-10 from Saginaw street northwest of Lounsbury avenue in Pontiac. The bid was awarded to Oak Construction Company of Royal Oak for \$193,855.05.

Fabricating and furnishing structural steel for a 5-ft-6-in beam span bridge to carry Michigan Avenue eastbound over the Detroit Industrial Expressway (M-112) near the east limits of the city of Dearborn was awarded to The R. C. Nelson Company of Detroit for \$35,478.00. Construction of the above bridge was let to Darin and Armstrong Inc. of Detroit, for \$167,826.88.




