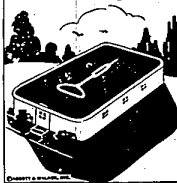

## REGISTRATION NOTICE

## Biennial Spring Election

Monday, April 7, 1947

To the Qualified Electors of the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland, State of Michigan:

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law", I, the undersigned Clerk, will, upon any day, except Sunday and a legal holiday, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter in said Township, not already registered who may apply to me personally for such registration. Provided, however, that I can receive no names for registration during the time intervening between the Twentieth day before any regular, special or official primary election and the day of such election.

The last day for General Registration does not apply to persons who vote under the Absent Voters' Law.

Notice is Hereby Given that I will be at 35720 Twelve Mile Road, every day and at Farmington Town Hall on Tuesday, March 18, 1947 — Last Day, the Twentieth day preceding said Election as provided by Sec. 3, Chapter 3, Part II, P. A. 306, 1929 and Sec. 1, Chapter 3, Part II, P. A. 1939, Act 31, P. A. 1941, and Act 281, P. A. 1945, from 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m. for the purpose of reviewing the registration and registering such of the qualified electors in said Township as shall properly apply therefor.

The name of no person but an actual resident of the Township at the time of registration, and entitled under the constitution, if remaining such resident, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration book.

March 18, 1947 is the last day for registration.
