### SNOW APPLE SURPRISE



2 cups thick apple sauce  
1/2 cup of honey or sugar  
1 lemon  
2 tablespoons gelatine  
1/3 cup cold water  
2 eggs

Pare, quarter and core tart apples. Add a small amount of water and let cook over a quick heat until tender. Press through a sieve. To two cups of thick sauce add the sweetening (honey or sugar) and the juice and grated rind of the lemon. Heat to the boiling point. Soften the gelatine in 1/3 cup of cold water; add to the above and stir until gelatine is melted. Chill. When mixture begins to thicken, add the stiffly beaten whites of two eggs. Turn into mold. When firm serve with a hollid custard made from the two egg yolks.


The Richard Wines of St. Francis are receiving congratulations on the birth of a new little daughter.


