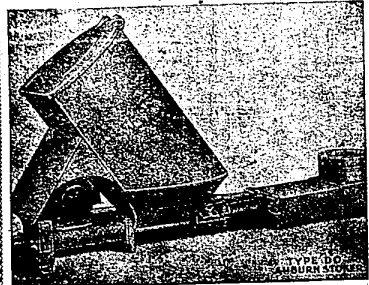

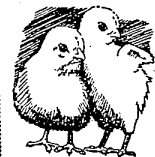

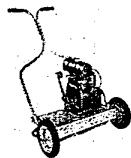

Bailey Gives Tips On Tree Spraying

It would take a small bulletin to catalog all the diseases and insects which may affect ornamental trees and shrubs, according to Karig, Bailey County Agricultural Agent. Even those pests which require a dormant spray would require an extended article to cover. There are, however, a few general rules which will be adequate for most conditions.

The most satisfactory dormant spray which can be used for the greatest number of pests is Dormant Oil. This material is made from lubricating oil and is available under a wide variety of names, such as Casco Dormant, Dentrul, Dormol, Emulso, Kleen-up, Ready Mix, Peninsula Stanoil and Sunoco. There are many others, but at any rate, the ones mentioned above are usually obtainable from the local service stations. In most cases a 3 percent oil-water spray is used. When made simply by adding 1 1/2 cups of oil to 1 gallon of water, or 3 cups of oil to 5 gallons of water, or 1 1/2 gallons of oil in 50 gallons of water - this makes a 3 percent solution. When making small quantities it is a good idea to place the oil in a fruit jar with warm water and shake to emulsify thoroughly before adding to the remainder of the water. Dormant oil is one type of oil that will "mix with water."

Dormant Oil Spray should be applied when the trees are strictly dormant and when the temperature is above 40 degrees, Mr. Bailey states. Oil sprays are important in controlling scale insects, red mite, psylla and others. There are a few general rules that must be observed if the work is to be done successfully.

1. Spray the entire tree or shrub at one time. Don't spray half of the tree today and the other half tomorrow. In the latter case where the spray overlaps, injury may occur.

2. Oil sprays should not be used on trees with large buds, such as the maple, walnut, ash, hickory and horse chestnut. Where necessary to use a dormant spray, dormant lime sulphur is recommended.

3. When oil sprays are used, a time interval of several weeks should elapse before it is safe to apply sulphur sprays. This is particularly important with apples, so the best rule is to get the oil spray on early so that scale control will be effected at the proper time.

4. Oil sprays may affect the color of blue spruces temporarily.

5. Generally, oil sprays cannot be depended upon to control aphids.

6. Use a spray with plenty of pressure and volume for best results, so as to get thorough coverage of the plant.

7. A 3 to 5 percent dormant oil applied in late March or early April will control the majority of our most troublesome pests such as scales, mites and spruce gall. Some spray operators who do not customarily attempt to combine dormant lime sulphur with dormant oil. This practice should be discouraged by all spray operators as it will cause trouble.

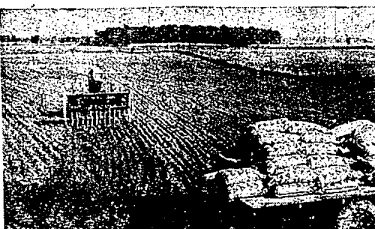

Demand for Fertilizer Tops Supply Despite Big Increase in Output, U. S. Report Shows



Fertilizer Use Has Been Greatly Expanded in Midwestern States.

CHICAGO — How farm demand for fertilizer has far outstripped the supply in spite of tremendous increases in production, was disclosed in a recent report of a special subcommittee of the U. S. House of Representatives' committee on agriculture.

The report, issued in Washington, was received here by the Middle West Soil Improvement Committee. It covers a preliminary survey of the 1947 fertilizer supply situation. "It is obvious," says the report, "that the basic difficulty facing farmers this spring is not with the exception of Kalamazoo (state of soda) an actual deficiency of supply, but rather an unprecedented demand."

"Fertilizer consumption has increased at the rate of about a million tons a year during the war, reaching a peak of 14,000,000 tons in

1946 compared to an average of 7,300,000 tons in the years 1933-39.

"Significant in the pattern of increased demand is the greatly expanded use of fertilizer in the Midwestern states, where previously little fertilizer was used. The most important factor in the changing pattern of fertilizer use, the report continues, is that, 'fertilizer plants have naturally been built primarily in areas of greatest use—in the Southeast and along the Atlantic seaboard.'"

But most new fertilizer plants now being constructed are located in Michigan. The source of the report is the Civilian Production Administration, which reports that 65 new plants and 44 major plant expansions have gone into operation in the past year and others are being constructed as fast as materials become available.

The worst outbreak of the disease in the United States began in the Midwest. The source of the virus that caused the outbreak has never been explained. It was not known that the disease existed on the North American continent at that time.

The disease is capable of affecting practically all cloven-footed animals. It is one of the most highly contagious diseases known with the disease, lesions which rupture and leave sore areas are found in the mouth and on the feet. Tests of cows may be affected. In hogs, the trouble is largely confined to the feet.

Killham urges everyone who comes in contact with animals to watch for symptoms of the disease.

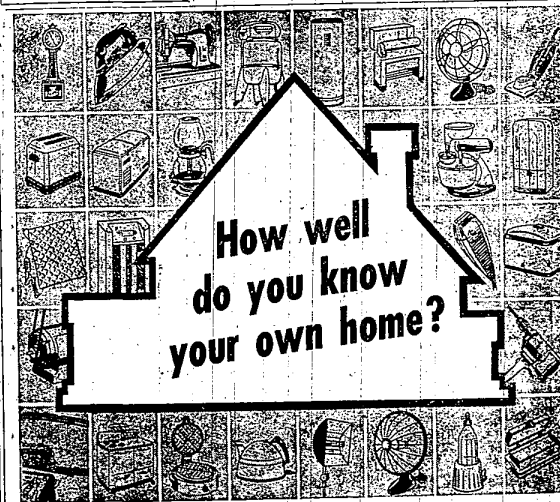
