Gordon Favors An Ombudsman

Maynard M. Gordon, a charter commission candidate in the May 16 cityhood election for Farmington Township, announces he favors a city council elected at-large and by districts.

"The government for the new city must be totally responsive to its citizens," says Gordon. "Districts of equal population, maybe four in number, must be represented by either three or five councilmen elected at-large."

Gordon also would like to see establishment of an "ombudsman" to handle

grievances against any city department or administrator. The new city, if an ombudsman is designated, could become one of the first in Michigan with such an official.

"If cityhood is voted, we should become a model for streamlined, 20th century government. Efficiency from the writing of the new charter should mean no increase in taxes."

Gordon, a five-year township resident, says he has no interest in holding office in the new government. He has served as president of Old Franklin Town Homeowners Assn., president of Fairview Elementary PTA and secretary - treasurer of Farmington Schools' Citizens Advisory Council.

He is vice president elect of the Farmington PTA District Council, member of Orchard Crest Swim Club and Franklin Racquet Club. He is an automotive publisher.
