Sheila Tobias, associate provost of Wesleyan University and national president of the Professional Women's Caucus, will speak at 8 p.m., Thursday, April 6, in Rackham Amphitheater, the University of Michigan campus, Ann Arbor.

Her topic will be "Educating Women for Leadership: A Program for the Future."

The lecture, last in the series, "Women in Perspective," is sponsored jointly by the Center for Continuing Education of Women and the Center for the Study of Higher Education. The lecture is free and the public is invited.

Miss Tobias, who occupies

one of the highest administrative posts held by a woman in a coeducational university, is widely known for her leadership of women's causes in academia.

As assistant to the vice-president for academic affairs at Cornell University, she introduced innovations in undergraduate education, including the Cornell Female Studies program.

At Wesleyan University she is specifically charged with female staffing, women's studies programs and courses, university relations with women of the community, and with guidelines on equal employment.
