Proposals may be mailed to Room 451, State Office Building, Lansing, Michigan. The work will consist of placing a 20 ft. concrete resurfacing course of wearing grade.

The Department's Standard Specifications (202 edition), the current "Bids Manual," the plans for the project, the special provisions governing this project, the contract and the employment and use of labor, and the proposed plans and specifications of the project, which are essential parts of the contract may be examined at the office of the Department at Bedford, Michigan, and at the Michigan Road Building Association, Lansing, Michigan, Room 421, State Office Building, Lansing, Michigan, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., of the day preceding the opening of the bids. A fee of three dollars will be charged for furnishing plans or proposal blanks.

Full cooperation in carrying out the special provisions will be required. Minimum wages paid to labor employed on this contract shall be as follows: Zone 1: Skilled labor \$1.50 per hour. Intermediate labor \$1.25 per hour. Unskilled labor \$1.00 per hour. Other rates as listed in the proposal.

A certified check or cashier's check on an open account, in the sum of \$1500.00, payable to Charles M. Ziegler, State Highway Commissioner, must accompany each proposal which such check will be returned promptly after the bidding, except that those of the two lowest bidders will not be returned until execution and delivery of the contract to the State Highway Department.

Z. ASCHENBRENNER NOW STATIONED IN KOBE, JAPAN

Pvt. Zae R. Aschenbrenner is presently on duty with the Eighth Army in Kobe, Honshu, Japan.

Kobe, Japan's second largest port is being utilized by the occupation army as a supply base. Before the war Kobe was Japan's import and export center. Surrounded by mountains and an unusual scenic beauty, it has been called one of the garden spots of Japan.

Colorful, crowded, and cosmopolitan, Kobe still manages to retain the oriental flavor, which made it one of the great cities of Japan before the war.

One of the unique spots in Kobe where Pvt. Aschenbrenner will continue to receive part of his army training is the Kobe Base Rifle Range. This range is located on the grounds of the Emperor's Imperial Palace. The palace, destroyed during raids on Japan, has been removed, and the range built near the spot where it stood formerly.

At the present time Pvt. Aschenbrenner is assigned to the 192nd Ordnance Company.

Pvt. Aschenbrenner entered the army in June, 1945 at Ann Arbor, Michigan. In the states he was stationed at Aberdeen, Maryland.

Pvt. Aschenbrenner went to Japan in December, 1946, and has been stationed at Kobe since his arrival.

He is the son of Dr. and Mrs. Aschenbrenner of Powers Road.

Precooked Foods

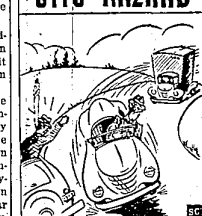
Handy Hint

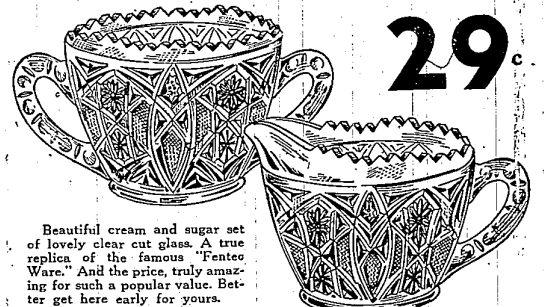
