On Good Friday, the August Terreault family of Columbia Avenue, Redford Township, formerly residents of Farmington Township, were the guests of the church service as a family which has triumphed over many adversities and trials'. The eight children in the family attended Bend School, and two of the boys attended Farmington High School.

Miss Claire Wallace, director of the program, "They Tell Me", which was broadcast over CKLW, said that she wished especially to praise Mrs. Terreault for her correspondence with the church. She said that she was deeply touched by the unselfishness of the bereft and bedridden elderly men and women and little children, about whose troubles she is concerned. Having been a shut-in herself, Mrs. Terreault knows how to welcome a letter and how to answer it. She sends out mail to the crippled, the burned, the ill and the convalescent, all over the country. "And not only that," said Miss Wallace. "She decorates the letters with little pictures and writes them with cherry little notes". She also indicated that Mrs. Terreault's work has brought her letters of praise from Walt Disney and Amos and Andy.

At the church service, the pastor has been dogged by bad luck for 13 years. They have had two serious fires, and each of the ten members of the family has had an accident requiring medical care.

World War I Widows Should Check Claims

Widows of World War I veterans who did not die of a service-connected disability may be eligible for pensions with the Veterans Administration. Many such widows have been denied a widow's pension because they failed to indicate that annual incomes were in excess of \$1,000. However, the claims are processed for only one year at a time, and women who were denied a pension during one year may be eligible for pension during a subsequent year. If such a widow feels sure that her income is less than \$1,000, she may request the amount stipulated, she should reopen her claim with the VA by submitting an affidavit stating that she expects to receive during the next year less than \$1,000.

Hospitalization

The laws and regulations governing the Veterans' Administration regarding hospitals and attention thereof, give priority and attention for treatment only to those who are in need of special conditions. Veterans desiring hospitalization on other than service connected conditions may be allocated to hospitals on a non-preferential emergency and a bed is available in a Veterans' Administration Hospital.

Veterans who have service connected disability may be granted hospitalization and treatment at his home locality on an

Prior authorization of such treatment of course must be granted by the Veterans Administration. The "Office of Veterans Affairs" provides hospitalization for service connected emergency cases which cannot be served by the Veterans Administration because of a shortage of beds in the Veterans Administration Hospital.
