### Track Letter Award System In Effect

To be eligible for a track letter, Coach Hutson announced the following: A runner must have a season total of 600 points. These bonus points are given: 10 for a dual meet; 15 for a triangular; and 30 for the league, regional, or state. Instead of receiving point credit at the rate of five points for first, three for second, and one for third, the track man's points equals the usual amount multiplied by ten. For runs, distances that is 440 or more, he receives credit for 1 1/2 times as many points.
