RED ARROW DIVISION TO HOLD PUBLIC SERVICE

This year the public is invited to attend the all faiths Red Arrow Memorial Day Service at 10 a.m., May 30, commemorating all who lost their lives in our Nation's wars, and will be held in the Garden of Honor, official 32nd Division burial plot in Westlawn Memory Gardens at 25200 Plymouth Road. Special buses will leave the Plymouth Coach Company Terminal at Plymouth Road, one block west of Grand River, running every ten minutes beginning at 9 a.m.

Special poems have been written by Ann Campbell and Edgar A. Guest. Ann Campbell has broken an out of town engagement in order to personally deliver her poem entitled "Spirit of the 32nd." Mr. Guest's poem will be delivered by Jerry Fournier, president of the Public Speaking Club of Denby High School. Edward Griffin, Redford High School Student who won the National Oratorical Contest will repeat the stirring proclamation of General John Logan given at the close of the Civil War, originating Memorial day. Anthony Pliskorski, commander of V. F. W. Post 2284, will read a special message from the late General W. H. Gill, commander of the 32nd during it's toughest days of World War II.

Ron Gamble of Radio Station WJR will introduce Brig. General Ralph A. Loveland, principal speaker and Rabbi Leon Form of Temple Israel, Rev. Fr. J. Wm. Griffith of Precious Blood Church, and Rev. Charles W. Hughes of St. Albans Church, Highland Park.

Jack Fisher of WXYZ, a Red Arrow veteran of World War II, will be one of the soloists, singing the "Lord's Prayer." The thirty voice a cappella choir of the Bethel Lutheran Church will give two numbers. Music will be furnished by the Red Arrow Band.

A special section of seats will be reserved for War mothers and five hundred men of the 42nd Infantry will act as Guard of Honor on the ground, while a Squadron of six bombers will act as Guard of Honor in the air flying at high altitude. Jack Fisher of WXYZ will drop dummies from the air from an altitude of about five hundred feet. The Air Honor Guard is under the command of Col. Frederick Anderson of the Michigan National Guard.
