The program tentatively will include, the building of a classroom and general purpose room for the Noble school area; expansion of the present Bond school to include classrooms and general room and a five room building, and heating plant for Farmington. Frederick D. Madison, Royal Oak architect, was selected by the Board to draw up the tentative plans.

The Board approved a plan to initiate a full time recreation program. They instructed Duncel and a representative of the Board to go before the City Commission and the Township Board in an effort to enlist their support behind a joint program. The City and Township are being contacted in an effort to plan a summer recreation program with a full time director. The program to be jointly financed and administered by the three groups. This program probably will not be ready until next year.

The regular summer program, similar to past years, will be carried on this summer. A full summer band and music program will be held. Mr. Lloyd Smith will have charge of the summer program. The Board also indicated that a program for smaller youngsters will be held again this year.


