


Flu Vaccines

FEAR EXPRESSED AS TRAFFIC TOLL SHOWS INCREASE

Fear that the long forecast toll war rise in the state's traffic toll has arrived is expressed by Capt. C. J. Scavarda, chief of the safety and traffic bureau of the Michigan State Police, with completion of statistics for the month of April revealing an increase in deaths and injuries.

The records show that there were 99 persons killed and 2,657 injured in 9,776 traffic accidents in Michigan last month. Compared with the same month of a year ago, deaths were up 13 per cent, injuries four per cent and reported accidents 26 per cent. The increase in casualties marked the first reversal in the downward trend which began in January of this year.

All of the net fatality increase occurred on rural trunk line systems, with a death toll of 65. Injuries on rural trunk lines were 28 per cent higher than in April of last year.

There were fewer pedestrian accidents in rural areas, but in urban areas 19 were killed, an increase of three. Run-off-roadway accidents accounted for eight of the rural death gain, indicating motorists were driving too fast for conditions.

"Mileage figures continue to exceed 1931 per car experience, and 113 persons lost their lives in traffic accidents, and this means deaths and injuries are bound to climb higher unless motorists and pedestrians alike take into consideration that there are more chances for accidents now and they should therefore drive and walk with greater care," Scavarda said.

Officials are particularly alarmed by the great differences in speed due to the large number of older cars and trucks sharing the road with a relatively small percentage of new cars which are being driven at a faster clip. This is resulting in improper passing and other violations.


