

The county agent said their findings showed one good spray mix-ture tested consisted of one and one-half pounds of 50 per cent wet-table DDT combined with 8 pounds of copper sulfate, 4 pounds of hy-drated lime and 100 gallons of wa-ter.

For dusting, three percent DDT in a 7 percent copper dust should give good results.


