The executive ouncil of the American Bankers council of the American Bankers Association pledged the support of member banks to the plan, as a valuable aid in the management of the national debt.

"Heretofore," Mr. Knickerbocker continued, "only employees in est-ablishments where the Payroll Sav-

ablishments where the Payroll Sav-ings Plan is made available have been able to buy Savings Bonds automatically, through allotments from their pay. The Bond-a-Month Plan extends a similar privilege to bank depositors to whom the pay-roll plan is not available, including roll plan is not available, including owners and employees in small business and industry, professional people, independent business men and women, farmers and others who are self-employed.
