NAVAL RESERVE
SEEKS RECRUITS
IN FARMINGTON
The United States Navy has launched a drive to recruit eligible Farmington men into the Naval Reserve. Lt. Commander L. R. Nowacki, U.S.N.R. commanding Division 5-76 announced this week.

Commander Nowacki stated that at present Division 5-76 of the Naval Reserve is meeting each Tuesday evening in temporary quarters at the Fordson High School, Schaefer and Ford Roads.

He went on to say that the Navy Department is now constructing a new Naval Armory in the City of Dearborn for training Reservists of all west-side and down-river communities. The Armory will be located near Lois and Osborne Avenues, in back of the Miller School. This site is very close to Michigan and Schaefer Roads where there is adequate public transportation. It is contemplated that the Armory will be used by three divisions of 200 men each and one Marine Company.

The new civilian Naval Reserve is open to all men between the ages of 17 and 40 and Reservists of World War II may join with their former war-time rating. A full day's pay is provided for each training session of two hours and opportunities for weekend cruises and two weeks active duty sessions are available. Classes are now forming to preserve the "know-how" that was so costly gained in the state war.

The education program of the Naval Reserve offers advancement in many skills and trades. Recreation facilities and social advantages make the civilian Naval Reserve very attractive to many young men.

The civilian Naval Reserve is made up of civilians and run by civilians in almost all its details and remains a part of the civilian body of people. Its members cannot be called to active duty without their permission except in time of National emergency and they may resign at will. It is a force for peace and democracy. All men citizens between the ages of 17 and 40, in good health and of honorable character are urged to join the Naval Reserve now.

Authorization forms and franked envelopes for mailing bonds are supplied by the Treasury Department to the banks. The executive council of the American Bankers Association pledged the support of member banks to the plan, as a valuable aid in the management of the national debt.

"Hereafter," Mr. Knickerbocker continued, "only employees in establishments where the Payroll Savings Plan is made available have been able to buy Savings Bonds automatically through allotments from their pay. The Bonds-Month Plan extends a similar privilege to bank depositors to whom the payroll plan is not available, including owners and employees in small business and industry, professional people, independent business men and women, farmers and others who are self-employed.

According to a Treasury Department spokesman, the plan is being carried out in Washington
