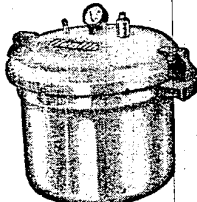

VETERANS

From the OFFICE OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS

OUT-OF-STATE VET ADVISOR TO ADDRESS CONFERENCE
Dr. Randall B. Hamrick, director of the Bridgeport (Conn.) Community Advisory Service Center will address the veterans' counselors of Michigan at their fourth annual conference at Pine Lake camp June 26, 27 and 28. The Office of Veterans' Affairs announces.

Dr. Hamrick, fourteen years a trained psychologist, has seen the Bridgeport center develop from meetings of a number of individuals and community groups discussing the problems of returning veterans to a full-scale one stop community advisory center with all state and federal services combined under one roof.

The Pine Lake conference, as it has come to be familiarly known by those in Michigan devoted to veteran assistance, will have representatives from Michigan's many veterans' counseling centers, veterans organizations and other groups interested in serving Michigan's 600,000 veterans. As a new device in the further training of these counselors, the conference will be in the form of a participating workshop, with those advisors able to speak from years of experience with returned servicemen of two wars, conducting group panels and discussion forums.

The Institute of Counseling, Testing and Guidance of Michigan State College has arranged to provide the services of two skilled counselors, Ray Hatch and Edg Har- den, to give a demonstration of good and bad counseling. Staff members of the Office of Veterans' Affairs will be on hand to act as resource persons in their many fields of activity.

DISCUSS NATION'S PETROLEUM SUPPLY

CORN LEADS CROPS IN STATE; ALFALFA, WHEAT RANK NEXT

Corn continues to be Michigan's leading farm crop, according to the 1945 agricultural census report. Figures in the federal census were for the crop year of 1944 and showed that corn produced in Michigan had a cash value of \$64,995,000.

Alfalfa, with the crop valued at \$35,360,000 ranked second, and third. Fourth in the list was oats valued at \$30,552,000. These crops, however, are not considered by farm management specialists at Michigan State college as "cash crops" in that most of the three grains and the hay are marketed through livestock on the farms and not sold.

For the crop year of 1944, Irish potatoes led the cash crops with a value of \$27,834,000. Dry beans followed in sixth place for total value with a crop worth \$26,115,000. Next in value was sugar beets valued at \$6,097,000. Barley, soybeans and sorghum hay were all in the three million dollar value group harvested.

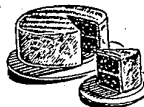
Some of the fruit crops harvested would rank high as crops, however. The 1944 apple harvest was valued at \$15,321,000 and peaches were second among fruit crops with a value of \$5,695,000. The cherry crop, value was listed at \$7,685,000 for third among fruits with grapes

fourth with a value of \$2,527,000.

Accounting for a third of the Michigan farm income is milk and milk products. In 1944 the value of these products amounted to \$21,760,000. Poultry products totaled \$38,890 and livestock other than dairy products and poultry (including beef cattle, swine, sheep) accounted for \$72,868,000.

It was through most of these animals, however, that a majority of the corn, oats, wheat and alfalfa crops were marketed.

Kills Mealy Bugs

If you find mealy bugs, red spiders or aphids on any of your house plants, try spraying them with a solution made of one teaspoon of nicotine sulphate in a gallon of water in which a one-inch cube of laundry soap is dissolved. Some of the mealy bugs will have to be picked off the plants by hand, with a splint or toothpick.

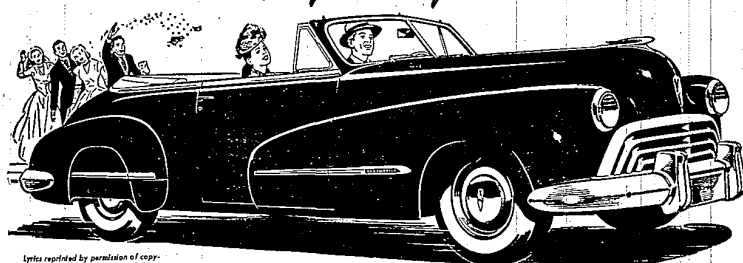
