facilities. The main floor of the addition might house the library, providing plenty of room for the books, and allowing for a reading room as well.

The upstairs of the proposed addition would be utilized by the Masonic Lodge. The membership has increased so greatly that the present quarters are no longer adequate to take care of regular meetings, let alone any public affairs of the Lodge.

If constructed, the addition will have a separate entrance, along Grand River Avenue, and will be dedicated as a memorial. The west end of the Park could be landscaped into a memorial garden.

This project has not been definitely adopted by the committee, and they still welcome any suggestions that individuals or organizations may wish to make. Communication should be directed either to Ernest Blanchard, chairman of the committee, or to Mrs. H. A. McIntyre, secretary.
