### Study of Flea Shows

**Remarkable Evolution**  
The most intensive study ever made of the anatomy of the flea by R. E. Snodgrass of the department of agriculture has just been issued by the Smithsonian Institution.

The study shows the flea is fearfully and wonderfully made. Millions of years of evolution have gone into the evolution of a creature all most perfectly adapted, through extremely complicated physical mechanisms, for its parasitical life in the world.

A little of the flea's life history shown through the ages is revealed by this examination. Once, for example, it was a free creature. Vestiges of wings still can be found in one of its development stages. As it became more and more strictly parasitic on warm-blooded animals the need for flying disappeared and the legs were developed into marvellously efficient organs for jumping — the creature's chief means of locomotion. Extremely complex is the flea's feeding apparatus. When a starved cat flea is allowed to feed, it becomes voracious. The flea's mouthparts, the prospect of blood. Hence, if a forefinger is offered it as a food source, it may be observed liberally in any position under the finger. It has a strong spotlight turned on it.

**Hot-Caps Aid Plants**  
**In Getting Start**

Hot-caps, which serve as miniature individual greenhouses for plants, are recommended to home gardeners. Hot-caps are hat-shaped, especially treated, paper plant covers. They protect plants from wind, cold and the direct sun while the plants are getting started. Hot-caps can be placed over tomato, pepper, cabbage and other early plants. They can also be used over hills of melon, squash and similar tender crops to hasten seed germination and protect young plants.

After the hot-caps are placed over the plants, the soil should be packed all around the edge so no wind can get underneath and blow the cap away. After the cap is set, it is best to punch a small hole near the top on the side away from the prevailing wind to permit ventilation.

Ten days to two weeks is about the maximum time that plants should be left under hot-caps. Such treatment will bring an earlier, heavier crop.

**Good Concrete**  
To make good concrete, the cement should be fresh and free of lumps, and the sand should be evenly graded in size and free of dirt. Clean water, free of leaves and trash, should be used. Use of too much water is the common mistake in mixing concrete. Improper curing is another common mistake. As soon as concrete has hardened for a few hours, it should be wet thoroughly and kept wet for five days by covering with burlap bags or a few inches of earth. A cubic yard of concrete requires about six sacks of cement and is sufficient to construct a square foot of concrete floor 4 inches thick when using one part cement, two parts sand and three and one-half parts crushed stone or gravel.

**Control Pests**  
Mosquitoes, lice, many common flies, the horn fly, the sheep tick and the brown dog tick, all well-known farm animal pests, may now be safely controlled by proper use of DDT. This new insecticide, widely publicized since its successful use by the army forces, was synthesized more than 70 years ago and brought to this country in 1942. DDT is a white or yellowish-white crystalline compound soluble in many organic solvents and partly soluble in mineral and vegetable oils. Some of the more common solvents are xylene, soybean oil, cottonseed oil, fuel oil and kerosene.

**Oil Center**  
Countries of the Near and Middle East possess an estimated 40-odd per cent of the world's known petroleum wealth. The area involved is a relatively small one, lying between the Black and Caspian seas, the Mediterranean and the Indian ocean. Outstanding producers in this "golden triangle of oil" are the Soviet Union, Iran, Iraq and Saudi Arabia. The latter United in oil operations with the adjoining island of Bahrain. Important but smaller supplies are obtained from Egypt and from the United Arab sheikhdom of Kuwait, near the head of the Persian gulf.

**Uses for Tung Oil**  
Four-fifths of the tung oil is used in top-grade paints and varnishes. Large amounts are used by linoleum and oilcloth manufacturers. The oil goes into printing inks, electric insulating compounds, automobile brake linings, lacquer linings for tin cans. Its wartime uses included weatherproofing cannon shells, rifle cartridges, tank guns, tents and vehicle covers, and a wide variety of military fabrics.

**Use Knife Wisely**  
Never use a knife to cut wire, tin cans, kindling wood, boxes and other hard materials. Nearly all broken knives are the result of using them for heavy work that they aren't intended for.

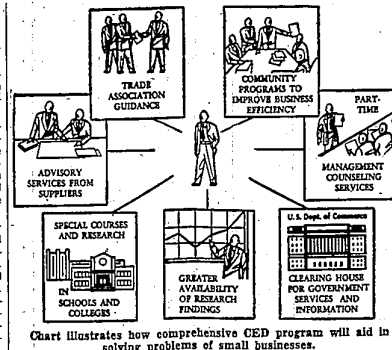


Chart illustrates how comprehensive OED program will aid in solving problems of small businesses.

### Experiment With

**Stitching Without Thread**  
The seamless robe of Biblical days may soon take the form of the newest fashion and adorn the most modern of women. An experiment with acetate rayon fabrics is in progress which may permit stitching without thread.

Cellulose acetate textiles are thermoplastic and therefore can be melted by heat. Use of an electric needle melts the yarns and seals the fabrics together without use of thread. Thermoplastic acetates have already made possible some excellent more fabrics. Reaction of these acetates to heat permits the embossing of watermarks in such a way that they permanently withstand cleaning or washing.

Starchless shirt collars are made of part cotton and part acetate to make them remain permanently stiff. Belts made on the same principle can be washed or drycleaned without damage.
