Harvest Methods Affect Barley

Better harvesting methods help produce better barley, says R. E. Decker, head of the farm crops de-partment at Michigan State collega. Harvesting at the right time is Harvesting at the right time is important in barloy production. Barley that is cut before it is ripe is lower in test weight and contains green kernels which are not suitable for malting. Harvesting should not start until the straw is completely yellowed and the kernels are hard.

When threshing is done with either a combine or a grain separator the heads should be dry and the moisture content of the grain down to 14 per ceut. If the grain is damp, the kernels are often skin-
