There will be ample supplies of safe pasteurized milk in practically all of the resort areas of Mehigan this season. Arrangements have been made for ample supplies for all regions in lower Mildelbands of various and the same supplies for all regions in lower Mildelbands of various and the same supplies with milk from entitle supplies with milk from outside areas. To meet this demand additional supplies of milk have been inspected and approved by the Department of Agrigiditure for shipment to Bauthart Traiverse City, Charlevoix and Petoskey. Additional bottled milk from Miland and Bay City is now available for the Houghton Lake area and for the Oscoda and Tawas City area. Additional supplies of inspected milk from the Detroit market will be used in the Port Iluron and Thumb areas.

The only probable shbrtages may be in parts of the upper peninsula where stricter enforcement may exclude some supplies. Shortages in any area will not be drastic as good milk can be made available if necessary.
