The Horse Pulling Contest should attract the largest and best field of pullers ever to attend the Milford Fair as this year the prizes are the largest ever posted.

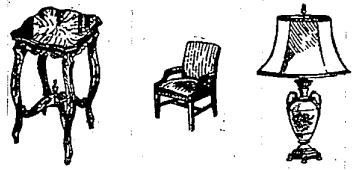
Harry Iwata Attends Ohio State University
