STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO OBSERVE FOUNDRING

The Michigan Department of Health, one of the pioneer organizations of its kind in the United States, will observe the 74th anniversary of its founding July 30.

The first health board established in the country, it began work at a time when sanitary science was in its swaddling clothes...

In June of 1870, the State Medical Society, meeting in Lansing, heard a paper by a returned regimental surgeon from the War of Rebellion who advocated the creation of a state board of health...

Dr. Richard M. Olin who had been appointed by Governor Sleep in April, 1917, as secretary of the State Board of Health.

At the quarter centennial celebration of the Department in 1898, a Chicago Health Commissioner pointed out that the Michigan Department of Health "has made growth more perfect, decay less rapid, life more vigorous, and death more remote for every citizen within the boundaries of this fair state"

through its program of supervision, advice, consultation, instruction and education.

The Department of Health, which Governor Siger called "world famous" in his message to the legislature this year, has received wide publicity during the past decade.

Visitors from every section of the civilized world have come to Lansing to observe the department's organization and function and requests for assistance in health problems have come to the Department from the far reaches of the globe.
