LATEST WORD IN JACKET BLURB

The three new, interesting books reported here have been added to your town library.

"Prince of Foxes" by Shellabarger is more historical fiction from the pen of the author of "Captain From Casille". The author is a student of the Renaissance Period from which the story comes. He has had many years of residence and study in Europe, giving first hand information of the languages, customs and backgrounds for his books. It begins in Venice where Andrea has gone to visit an artist. Here he meets Camilla who leads him into dangerous paths from which only a fox could extricate himself.

"All About House Plants" by Free was published and written cooperatively by the American Garden Guild and the publisher. It is all about house plants and gives full information on what to grow and how to grow it. Photographs, many in color, supplement the text in a practical way. It tells how to care for and propagate all kinds of plants adaptable for house culture. Such points are covered as suitable conditions for growth, arrangement of plants for decorative effects, sowing, potting and repotting, combating pests, etc.

There are chapters devoted to flowering plants, foliage plants, bulbs, ferns and cacti. The making and care of such indoor types of gardening as terrariums and dish gardens are treated in detail. The book has an excellent index.


