## REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Farmington Township School District, July 14, 1947.  
The annual meeting of the Farmington Township School District was held in the gymnasium, July 14, 1947. The meeting was called to order by the President, Dr. R. Aschenbrenner. Members present: Z. R. Aschenbrenner, M. D.; Jess A. Early; F. E. Labadie; Paul R. Schreiber; Howard M. Warner.  
Also present: 53 people from the district.

1. Minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.  
2. President Aschenbrenner requested Mr. Glenn Leland, Auditor of the financial records of the district, to read the financial report. The report was read, all questions answered by Mr. Leland, and the report was approved.  
3. A report prepared by Mr. O. E. Dunckel, Superintendent, was read and accepted.

4. President Aschenbrenner requested an expression from the people regarding their wishes as to pay for members of the Board of Education. There was a motion by Mr. F. Winkman, seconded by Mr. J. Bolt, that the Board should receive a total of \$400.00 yearly with the schedule of distribution to the Board members left, to the discretion of the board together with a total of \$200.00 to be set aside to cover expenses of Board members when called outside the district on school business. MOTION CARRIED.

5. The report from the Treasurer of the school Board was read and accepted, said treasurer's report to become part of the minutes.  
6. Motion by Howard Warner, seconded by D. Gerald Domes, to transfer \$3,000.00 from the bond Retirement fund to the Building and Site fund. MOTION CARRIED.

7. Motion by Howard Warner, seconded by Mr. Briggs, to adjourn. MOTION CARRIED.

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## 3 KILLED ABOARD IMMIGRANT SHIP



HAIFA, PALISTINE — SOUNDPHOTO — British troops carry an  
injured immigrant and his belongings off the immigrant ship "Exodus  
1947", in the port of Haifa. The vessel, formerly the American fruit  
ship "Pres. Warfield" was intercepted by units of the British Navy  
off Haifa and a boarding party which the British sent out was met  
with some opposition. A bitter battle followed and when the smoke  
and tear gas cleared up, one American seaman aboard the Exodus was  
killed, as were two other immigrants. Four were wounded, 4,700  
immigrants were aboard the vessel.
