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CONTROL PLANES BEING USED TO POLICE AIRWAYS

Control planes from the Michigan Department of Aeronautics will start this week to be on the lookout for violators of state flying rules. Regulations as part of the Michigan Air Safety Program, Col. Lloyd E. Evans, Director, announced.

The pilots of the state owned control planes have been instructed to chase planes flying low or buzzing, follow the violators to their destination and obtain their names for prosecution.

The action, according to Evans, resulted from the increased number of aircraft accidents and collision reports this summer caused primarily from reckless and careless flying on week ends.
