Now that reprints are coming out again libraries have been able to stock up with a few of the old standbys enjoyed in the past generations and still popular with the new generation. Here are a few recently added to the local library in Farmington. "The So Stories" by Kipling is a book containing all of the old favorites from "How The Camel Got His Hump" down through "The Ship-Song of Old Man Kangaroo" and "The Cat That Walked by Himself". Mr. Gleason is the illustrator of this work and his clever sketches run all through the book. "Black Beauty" by Sewall is one of the favorite animal stories with juvenile readers. This story is still enjoyed by old and young. It is illustrated by Edwin John Pritts and the pictures are the same as they were in earlier editions. "Rebecca of Sunnybrook Farm" by Wiggin is probably the most popular of Kate Douglas Wiggin's stories.
