RUSSIA USES VETO



LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y. — SOUNDPHOTO — The upraised hand of Soviet delegate Andrei Gromyko indicates that he wishes to abstain from voting on paragraph four of the American plan for a United Nations Border Commission in Greece aimed at curbing repeated Balkan "threats to peace and security". His action at last week's session of the United Nations Security Council in Lake Success, N. Y., was the same as each preceding and succeeding paragraph, but when the vote came on the overall proposal, his right hand went up to signify Russia's great power of veto, which killed the plan. 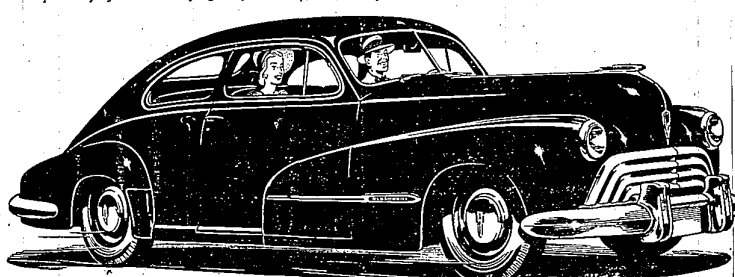
