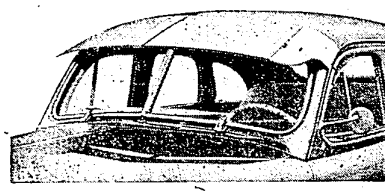

LATEST WORD IN JACKET BLURB

You will find the following books which are recommended for your reading pleasure at the local library in the Town Hall.
 "When The Stars Come Out" by Dr. Baker, a professor of astronomy at the University of Illinois, tells the story of our solar system and its relation to the universe. The book holds the enthusiasm of an star gazer and the caution of an experienced astronomer. It is highly recommended to anyone who is beginning his reading in astronomy. The manners of presentation and five night-sky photographs would even interest younger classes in searching the skies. The author makes astronomy a vital part of life instead of a coldly aloof science. Here are some of the chapter headings: "The Stars in Their Courses", "The Moon in the Moon", "When The Sun is Eclipsed", "Celestial Fireworks" and "Distant Suns".
 "Report To Saint Peter" by Van Loon started out to be the autobiography of the author. It covers only his younger days, for the author died before the work was completed. Van Loon was always more interested in airing the grievances of the human race than he was in talking about himself. So he dwells on man's cruelty to man, the insensate folly of religion and the state, and the undying quest for liberty, the quest of nations who revert to barbarism, the solace of music and similar high and important matters. Some of his other works are: "Van Loon's Lives", "The Story of Mankind", "The Arts" and "Thomas Jefferson".
 "Holdfast Gaius" by Shepard and Shepard is a historical novel, closely woven and solidly based upon fact and it is a magnificent panorama of the first generation of American independence. The story sweeps from the Connecticut seaboard to the Mississippi and the Gulf, from the burning of New London by Benedict Arnold to Andrew Jackson's heroic victory at New Orleans. It is the saga of Holdfast Gaius, a giant Mohican Indian whose tribe has been crushed by Arnold's massacre at Fort Griswold. Holdfast discovers a plot being formed by American traitors and delays a part of the squadron sent by the British general to seize New Orleans. Running six hundred miles in six days, Holdfast carries news of the attack in time to bring the men of Western Waters down the river to help Jackson in the greatest battle in American history.

U. S. Exports Now Stand At 16 Billion Dollar Mark
 As exports decline, the domestic market will have to absorb additional supplies of both agricultural and industrial products. However, additional foreign loans may delay a decline in exports.
 The value of U. S. exports of goods and services is over twice the value of our imports. Exports are now occurring at the rate of about 16 billion dollars each year. Imports, on the other hand, are around 7 billion dollars. This approximate 9 billion dollar difference between our imports and exports is paid by the importing countries from U. S. dollars accumulated by them during the war, newly mined gold, sale by them of U. S. securities which they own, and loans from public and private sources in the United States. If these large scale loans are not forthcoming, a reduction of exports is likely as dollar balances and U. S. securities run out.
 Exports of U. S. goods and services have increased rapidly since the first of the year and are now about four times as large as in 1940, according to Lawrence Witt, agricultural economist at Michigan State college.
 Michigan agriculture is not affected as much as industry by the recent increases. Exports of agricultural products reached high levels earlier and now are not increasing as rapidly as exports of industrial goods. The large volume of exports has helped to maintain high levels of industrial production and purchasing power in the United States.
