Pittsburg, Onice Erickson of Detroit will have the fourth grade at Noble school. She holds a life certificate from Northern Michigan College of Education. D. Vivian Hapke, whose home is in Berkley, will teach the third grade at William Grace school. She holds a D. S. degree from Michigan State Normal College.  
The following eight teachers will join the Farmington high school faculty: Claire George from West-nora, Mass., will teach English. Dennis McCarthy will teach social studies. He holds a degree from Central Michigan College of Education. Ernest McBride, from Plymouth, will teach social studies. He also has a degree from Central Michigan College and has had graduate work at Rutgers. Ann Metzger, whose home is in Toledo, Ohio, will have girls Physical Education and Health. She is a graduate of Michigan State College. Ruth Skitch will teach home making in the high school and she holds a degree from Michigan State College. Her home is in Detroit. Robert Sill, who holds a degree from Albion College and has graduate work in music from the University of Michigan, will teach vocal music and speech. Lawrence Timmons will teach shop and has his degree from Central Michigan College of Education.  
Heavy Enrollment Expected  
Dunkel stated that in spite of the two classroom addition to the high school gymnasium, it has been necessary again this year to rent two rooms in the Methodist Church. Enrollments in excess of 40 pupils are expected in the second grade room at the Bond school, the first and fifth grade at Farmington and the fourth grade at Noble school as well as all grades at William Grace school. He added that the most serious problem is at William Grace where enrollment is expected to exceed 50 in the first grade. Dunkel stated that, "should this number be reached, half day sessions or temporary quarters will be necessary."

Kindergarten pupils in the Bond area will attend the German school at the morning session and those from the Noble-William Grace area in the afternoon. Kindergarten students in the Farmington area, west of Farmington Road, will attend the Fairview school in the morning, others from the Farmington area in the afternoon session.

the question of increasing the millage above the 15 mill limitation. Only taxpayers are qualified to vote on the millage question, which must pass by a two-thirds majority.  
The proposed gymnasium would cost an estimated \$116,000. The building would contain a regulation basketball floor with a seating capacity of 1000 persons. Separate hot and cold showers for both boys and girls are included according to the proposed plans. A practice and storage room for the band is also being planned.  
According to a spokesman for the Board, the cost to the taxpayers would be 11 mills or 1.1 per cent. "In other words, if a house is assessed at \$1,000 on the tax rolls it would mean \$11.00 for five years," the spokesman stated.
