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GEORGE GULLEN, JR. SPEAKS BEFORE EXCHANGE CLUB

The Farmington Exchange Club held its first meeting of the new season on Wednesday noon. Following luncheon at noon, Curt Hall, program chairman for the day, introduced George Gulen Jr., nephew of Exchange Loyal Gulen.

"Service Clubs function Relative To 'The World Situation' is the topic Mr. Gulen selected. He pointed out that today, more than ever before, the problems of the people of our countries are our problems. Today, when it is possible to circle the globe in 72 hours, the remotest part of the world is just around the corner. Public opinion has never been as forceful as it is today, and because of this two factors are of paramount importance: first, that the public must be better informed and kept abreast of current developments; second, that the public must act on the information they have. Mr. Gulen stressed the importance of voting in all elections, and serving wherever and whenever possible, both in clubs, in the community, and, of course, in the nation.

In summarizing his talk, the speaker pointed out that mankind the world over is, after all is said and done, no different than we are. Next week Wednesday, September 10, the program is in charge of Charles Stuart, and he will present Paul Gaskins as speaker.

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building. The question was voted on in July of this year and lost by 7 votes. Then Clarenceville citizens immediately petitioned the Board of Education for another special election. The petition bore the names of 116 voters of the District.

Two questions will be voted upon by the qualified electors. The first involves the increase of millage above the 15 mill limitation law. The second involves a vote on a bond issue. Qualified electors must be citizens of the United States, 21 years of age, must be residents of the State for the past six months and of the school district 20 days, and must be registered in the school district. The above qualifications are all that are necessary on the millage increase. However, on the bond issue an added requirement is that the voter must be a property owner assessed for school taxes.

The estimated cost of the proposed gymnasium building has been set at approximately \$110,000. Bonds will be sold to the party offering the lowest interest rate for a bid basis. This has been estimated at approximately 2 per cent. The bonds will be paid off in equal amounts over a period of five years. An increase of 11 mills for 5 years will be necessary to pay off the bonds. This is an increase of \$11 per year for five years on a \$1,000 valuation.
