VETERANNEWS

From the OFFICE OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS LANSING

SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFIT PAYMENTS DUE SURVIVORS OF WORLD WAR II VETERANS Federal old age and survivors' insurance protection is available to families of qualified veterans of World War II for a period of three years following the veterans' discharge from the armed services.

In order for his survivors to be qualified, a veteran must: (1) Have been discharged under conditions other than dishonorable within four years and one day after the official end of World War II. (2) Have served in the armed forces at some time on or after September 16, 1940 and before the official end of the war. (3) Have had at least ninety days of active service, or have been discharged because of a disability service or aggravated while in service. (4) Have died within three years of the date of his discharge.

The minimum monthly benefit under this amendment to a widow and one child is \$24.14, paid monthly until the child is eighteen years of age. The maximum benefit to a widow with three children, or to four children alone, of a veteran with five years' service would be \$55.10 a month.

Benefits like other old age and survivors' insurance benefits are payable only when claims for them have been filed, and are payable retroactively only for three months prior to the date of filing.

Social Security benefits are not payable in cases where compensation or pensions are payable by the Veterans Administration.

Survivors should contact the nearest Social Security Administration field office.

CHOOSE DIRECTORS FOR NEW UNITED HEALTH FUND

Oakland County is represented on the Board of Directors of the newly organized United Health and Welfare Fund of Michigan, which was incorporated recently in Lansing. James M. Shackleton, Saginaw banker, was elected president of the organization, which has as its purpose uniting of the many national and state-wide health and welfare drives into one annual campaign.

Chosen for the Board of Directors from Oakland County were Paul N. Averill of Birmingham; Roger J. Emmert of Pontiac; H. H. Gardner of Birmingham; A. C. Girard of Pontiac and Ernest W. Seaborn of Birmingham. Mr. Gardner will also serve on the executive committee.

Proposing to eliminate repeated calls upon civic leaders by combining the many national and state-wide health and welfare appeals into a single annual drive, the sponsors of the new organization declared: "In creating the United Health and Welfare Fund of Michigan, we affirm our belief in the need for adequate support of the approved health and welfare agencies and in this organization as an eminently practical and competent means of providing such support."



