Fainting Over Wallpaper
When peening old wallpaper with amulsion paint, first test a small area for "bleeding through" if the paper has designs which are fairly colorful or if of a deep tint. At the same time make sure that any loose places in the wallpaper are firmly panted down, so that the surface will be firm and smooth before painting. Failure to observe this simple precaution may result in the equivalent of blisters or cracks in the finished paint job.


